Below are some suggestions of eligible items for the FOF Producer Cost-Share Program. This list is not exhaustive – if you have a completed audit or audit preparation item that you would like to make and are not sure if it's eligible, please reach out to Alison Patrick at apatrick@ccbh.net.

NOTE: purchases of multiple types are acceptable. Regardless of number of audit or audit preparation items purchased, maximum reimbursement will be \$4,000 total per producer.
